## Election Results

In the May 2003 Reigate & Banstead Council elections, Liberal Democrats were **the only party to make a gain**. As well as retaining all our current Council seats, we won a hard fought seat in Earlswood and Whitebushes. We are now the second largest party on the Council, making us the official opposition to the Conservative administration.

Nationally, this year's elections saw Liberal Democrats achieve the highest ever share of the vote, 30 per cent, taking seats from both Labour and the Tories.

## No Council Democracy

Many organisations in the Borough request Councillor representation at meetings. Liberal Democrat Councillors are always anxious to volunteer where they can be of assistance, so we applied for 6 volunteer posts where we felt we were able to contribute constructively. As the second largest party on the Council, we expect to represent our residents on a fair pro rata basis, however, the Conservative administration who make all these decisions, decided to use there own undemocratic process in an attempt to exclude Liberal Democrats from serving on any voluntary organisation. Of the 30 voluntary appointments made after the election, the Tories took 23, Labour were given 3, the Residents Associations 3 and one Independent . If you ever meet a Conservative Councillor, ask them if they think that's democratic and if it's in the interest of residents?

## Phone Masts

The shock announcement that Orange planned to install mobile phone communication masts in a number of densely populated areas of the Borough, led to a vigorous campaign of opposition by residents and your Liberal Democrat Councillors.

Orange has said that, if the Council seriously objects to lots of small masts, an option is to erect one very large powerful one that would be visible for miles!

Liberal Democrat Councillors will continue to support residents, who feel very concerned about the impact on health and property values, in the fight against phone masts.

# National and Local...

"The Governments failing environmental strategy is turning Britain into one giant rubbish dump" - Liberal Democrat MP, Norman Baker.

Over 65 million tonnes of rubbish was dumped or buried last year. This includes:

**BURIED** - 6bn disposable nappies

**BURIED** - 24m car tyres

**DUMPED** - 94,000 fridges

**DUMPED** - 5,600 tonnes of furniture

**DUMPED** - 42.2m bags of rubble

**DUMPED** - 226,000 old cars

**BURIED** - 32m printer cartridges

**BURIED** - 2m mobile phones

**DUMPED** - 468m batteries

**BURIED** - 32m glass bottles

**BURIED** - 972m plastic bottles

Waste is the product of modern living, but dumping and burying are not the solution. Recycling services must be improved to cope. The £650 million spent bailing out the nuclear industry could have paid for national doorstep recycling - twice over!

Some years ago, Conservative run Surrey County Council entered into a contract for waste management with a company that promised to drastically improve Surrey's recycling rate. It still hasn't implemented the promised Materials Recycling Facilities and Surrey County Council's waste management strategy has singularly failed to manage Surrey's waste.

Your Liberal Democrat Councillors implemented doorstep collection of recyclable rubbish in 1997, despite massive Tory objections. After five years in power, the Conservatives have only just got back to the level of recycling we achieved in 1998.

There has been no new innovation by this Tory Council.
